We recognise that Uniformed Organisations are committed to developing young people intellectually, physically and spiritually, encouraging them to be responsible citizens who play a full and active part in their local community.

INCIVILITY?

Incivility refers to any act which is harmful to or contributes to the degradation of your living environment. This can include vandalism, fly tipping, littering and graffiti.



Vision

We wish to benefit further from the commitment and dedication of your organisation, its Leaders and its members. We believe that together we can make Glasgow a cleaner, greener, safer city.

We wish to encourage you to take pride in your local neighbourhood, share in its successes and enable your local community to feel safer in an environment that is cleaner and greener.

We can help, but we need you to play your part. This could be in the form of organising clean-ups or carrying out environmental improvements in your area.

This leaflet outlines how you can play your part in your community and how we will help you do that.

How you can help us

We need your help to make your neighbourhood cleaner and safer. There are some simple things you can do to make a difference to where you live.

- Report any fly-tipping you see
- Report graffiti, vandalism and excessive littering
- Report any antisocial behaviour you can see in your neighbourhood
- Encourage neighbours, family and friends to take pride and good care of their neighbourhood by:
 - Not dropping litter
 - Disposing of litter and refuse in a responsible way, recycling when possible
 - Being a responsible dog owner – bag it and bin it
 - Treating others and the environment with care and respect

What Clean Glasgow will offer your organisation

- Action that you take, such as being involved in a local "Clean Up" event, will contribute towards your community award
- The opportunity to adopt a community 'hot spot' area where litter and vandalism are a particular concern
- A Community Tool Kit that will provide you with all the resources you will need
- Financial incentives and awards for your organisation
- Civic recognition for your organisation
- Civic recognition for the individuals who participate through the award of the unique Clean Glasgow Badge.
- Opportunities to access resources that will further the aims of your organisation



Getting started

To get started, contact the Clean Glasgow Community Action Team who will help you access the Community Tool Kit. The Tool Kit includes:

- Guidance and support on how to organise clean ups and ideas to transform your neighbourhoods
- Protective clothing such as gloves, goggles and hats
- Materials to help you, such as paint, cleaning products and tools
- Removal of collected debris
- Educational materials such as lesson plans and activities that will help your organisation achieve its aims
